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



become a teacher?”

- ★ The sparkle in a student's eyes when they understand a new concept.
- ★ My School Counselor, Mrs. Shock, encouraged me to become a teacher. When I was in high school she would have me tutor younger students after school.
- ★ My fourth grade teacher, Mrs. Betty Howell, inspired me to become a teacher. She was strict, but fun. One of my fondest memories from elementary school is her reading *The Mouse and the Motorcycle*, and how she would change her voice for each character and make the motorcycle noises.
- ★ My grandmother, she taught me so many life skills that I wanted to teach to others who are not fortunate enough to have a grandmother like mine to teach them.
- ★ My parents
- ★ I enjoy working with children and watching them learn.
- ★ As a child, I would come home from school and play school with my grandfather. He was an immigrant from Prince Edward Island and had only a fourth grade education. He always said that he learned more from me than any of his schooling. He wanted me to become a teacher. After working as an accountant for several years, I started subbing where I found that teaching was really my passion. Working with children and seeing them learn meant more to me than sitting behind a desk, by myself, looking at ledger books and computing numbers. I worked at getting certified and the rest is history.
- ★ My former teachers inspired me to become a teacher. They believed in me and my abilities before I even did. I'll always be grateful for that.
- ★ My mom because her passion for teaching art inspired me to become an art teacher.
- ★ My college roommate was a business education major, and I liked business, so therefore, I followed her career path.

- ★ My 8th and 11th grade English Language Arts teachers both inspired me to become a teacher. They both helped me grow my reading and writing skills. These influential educators helped prepare me for college and my career.

The app gives users options to chat, share photos and meet up based on a smart phone's GPS location.</p>	<p>SKOUT</p>  <p>SKOUT is a location-based dating app and website. While users under 17 years old are unable to share private photos, kids can easily create an account using a different age.</p>
<p>WHATSAPP</p>  <p>WHATSAPP is a popular messaging app that allows users to send texts, photos, voicemails, make calls and video chats worldwide. WHATSAPP uses an internet connection on smart phones and computers.</p>	<p>TIKTOK</p>  <p>TIKTOK is a new mobile device app popular with kids used for creating and sharing short videos. In **English Language Arts**, students did a great job writing and presenting their Biography Reports! This month, they will be learning about verbs. Students will also start constructed response questions, practicing the RACE method they learned in class.

In **Reading**, Second Quarter AR Goal is due Wednesday, December 18. Students meeting their goal will attend a movie party on Friday, December 20. Students will be learning about the genres Fantasy and Expository Text. We will also be dividing into Literacy Groups to work on fluency, rate and expression when we read aloud.

In **Math**, students have been working hard on multiplying and are now starting long division. Division can seem scary, but we are trying to make it fun with cheeseburgers! Students are still loving Mrs. McLain's videos and cheers!

In **History**, students will be learning about the United States declaring its independence from Great Britain and becoming the great nation we are today. Students will learn about the Articles of Confederation, the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights.

In **Science**, students will continue studying about ecosystems and biomes. We will finish up this unit with lessons about water biomes, and begin presenting our biome projects.



In **English Language Arts**, the students did a fantastic job finishing their Animal Research Paper and presenting their Animal Research Google Presentation! They have learned to research, record information, organize their writing, and cite their sources within a paper. This month we will focus on adjectives. Students will also express their creativity through selected Christmas writing prompts.



In **Reading**, the Second Quarter AR Goal is due Wednesday, December 18. Students meeting their goal will attend a movie party on Friday, December 20. During December we will focus on finding the theme of a story, summarizing, and sequencing events in a story.



In **Math**, students have been working on fractions and ratios! They will continue learning about converting fractions, percents, and decimals as we move into December. Students are still loving Mrs. McLains videos and cheers!

In **History**, students will continue learning about world history. We will discuss the early Hebrews, Jewish beliefs, early Greece and Greek mythology. Students will also be learning about Sparta and Athens as well as Alexander the Great and the rise of Rome.

In **Science**, Students did an awesome job on their plant or animal cell models! We will be continuing our study of ecosystems in biomes. We will finish up this unit by learning about succession in ecosystems and how ecosystems are affected by changes.

In **English Language Arts**, students have started working on their Narrative essay using the writing process. They have learned about citing sources to avoid plagiarism using in-text citations and a works cited page. The students will meet with me after each paragraph of this essay so they can learn what they are doing well and what they need to work harder on. After they finish these up in December, we will do a Semester review before Christmas break.



In **Reading**, Students will be finishing our class novel Letters From Rifka. Students will have a comprehensive test over what we have read as a class. We will be looking at some articles and poetry that go along with the text. We will also do some review over information that we have learned these last two quarters. The Second Quarter AR Goal is due on Wednesday, December 18. Students will also have a book report to turn in this quarter. The book report is due on Tuesday, December 17. Students have known about this book report for well over a month. Students may work on it in google classroom at any time.



In **Math**, students are finishing up their chapter on expressions. We have learned to write expressions, simplify expressions, and expand expressions. We will begin working with equations after Thanksgiving Break. Students will be writing and solving equations.

In **History**, The students are continuing a unit on Latin America. It involves the study of the Spanish and Portuguese influence on language and culture throughout the region, plus the blending of Native American, European, and African heritages.

In **Science**, students just learned about Electricity. Next up is Magnetism. We will learn about magnetic forces and fields, and how mass affects magnetism. We will also see how strong different magnets are and why.

In **English Language Arts**, the eighth grade students have finished learning about Verbs and have begun their Expository Essays on Social Media Safety. We are slowing this essay down to make sure no students are left behind on how to properly organize and complete all of the elements of this formal essay. After the finish this up in early December, we will begin a semester review of everything we have learned so far this year before Christmas break.



In **Reading**, students will be finishing our class novel The Boy in the Striped Pajamas. We will have a comprehensive test over what we have read and discussed as a class. We will be watching the movie adaptation of The Boy in the Striped Pajamas and comparing it the novel. The Second Quarter AR Goal is due on Wednesday, December 18. Students will also have a book report to turn in this quarter. The book report is due on Tuesday, December 17. Students have known about this book report for well over a month. Students may work on it in google classroom at any time.



In **Math**, Students will begin working with Systems of Equations. They will be solving Systems of Equations to figure out how many solutions each system has. They will learn the three different ways to solve Systems of Equations which includes: graphing, elimination, and substitution.

In **History**, The students are learning about the events that led to the American colonies declaring and winning their independence from Great Britain. In addition, they will be analyzing the struggles the new nation faced before creating a form of government that would make them a more United States.

In **Science**, students just finished learning about biodiversity and our ecosystem. Going into December they will start learning about adaptation and different types of selection. This will include natural selection and why certain species have certain traits.



EXPLORATORY

In **PE**, My PE classes will focus on learning the rules and how to play basketball and volleyball. They will also learn why communication in these two sports is very vital during the games.

In **Art**, students will continue on the Element of Art Texture by working on their Lion drawing for the yearbook contest. In December, we will be working on Christmas projects.

In **FACS 1**, students will be testing over Kitchen Safety, Baking Terms, and Kitchen Equipment to get into the kitchens and start cooking labs!

In **Keyboarding 1**, students are continuing to review their typing skills on the keyboard.

In **Keyboarding 2**, students will be working on various projects utilizing the skills they have learned in class while learning new concepts within Google Drive, such as Google Docs, Google Sheets, and Google Slides.

In **Yearbook**, students are continuing work to complete this year's yearbook.

In **Library Skills**, Students will continue reading and answering questions over the novel *A Wrinkle in Time*. After reading the novel we will watch the movie and compare and contrast the two.

In **ESL**, we will be continuing our work on Reading A-Z lessons. We will also continue our project based learning activities, while reinforcing Reading A-Z skills. As students learn with these activities, they will apply some of the skills with Christmas challenges. It's going to be a fun month.
